## **Guest Lecturer in Midwifery Science**

The incumbent will lecture on the midwifery course for 12 hours per week, undertake academic duties and assist in conducting state examinations (practical, oral and written). The successful candidate is expected to have a licence to practise as a midwife or delivery nurse, a scientific degree, a relevant academic record (e.g. current or completed doctorate, ongoing research) and the ability to lecture in German.

The position of guest lecturer will be remunerated up to pay grade 13 TV-H.

Job sharing is a possibility. Disabled people with identical qualifications will be preferred.
